### "Where's the large and flat basket, To Te?"




"I used it to carry the sweet potatoes, brother Ti."

### "It has corn in it, brother Ti!"




Ti is about to lose his mind. "But where's the bigbamboo basket that we use for the corn, To Te?"




#### "I brought it in the beginning, in case youcatch a huge fish!" To Te says.
