Look at the soil, my friend. The grass is so green here!



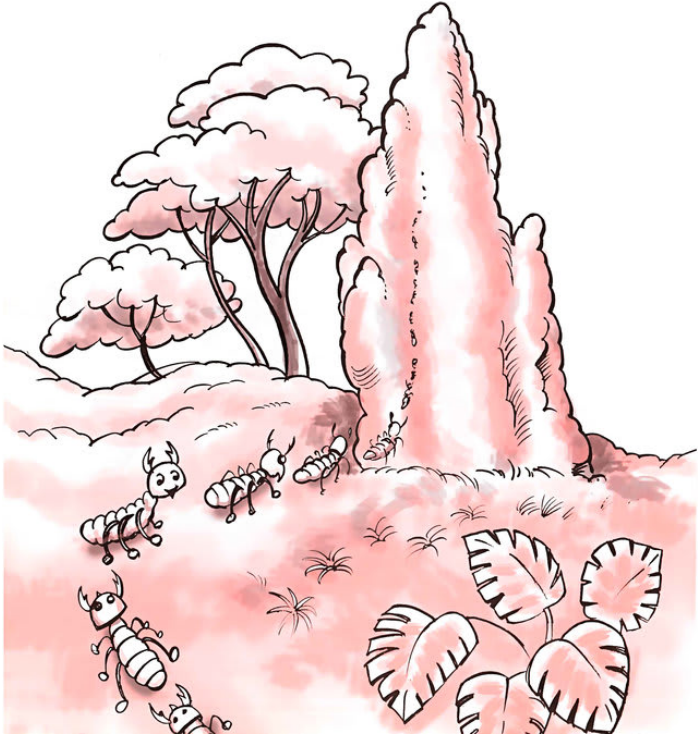
This is where flowers bloom.
They smell so sweet!



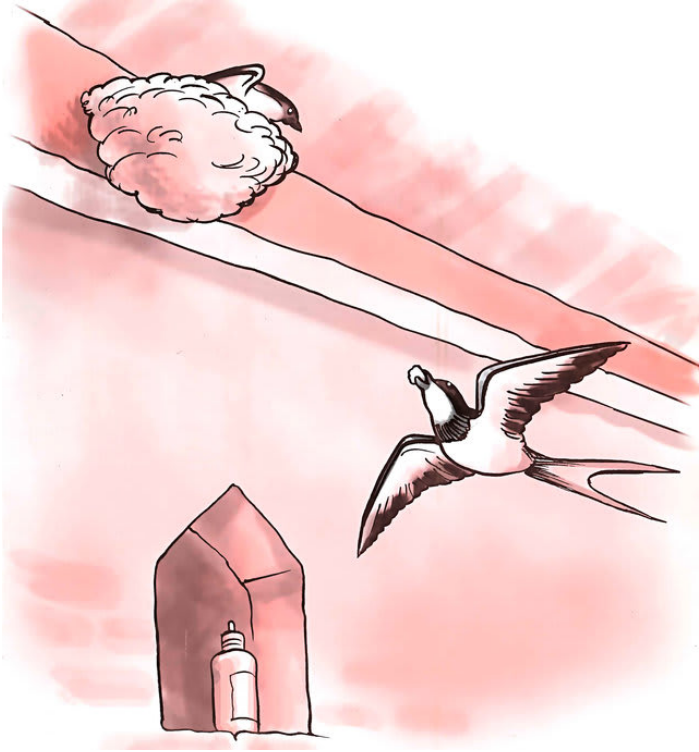
This is where
rice and wheat grow.



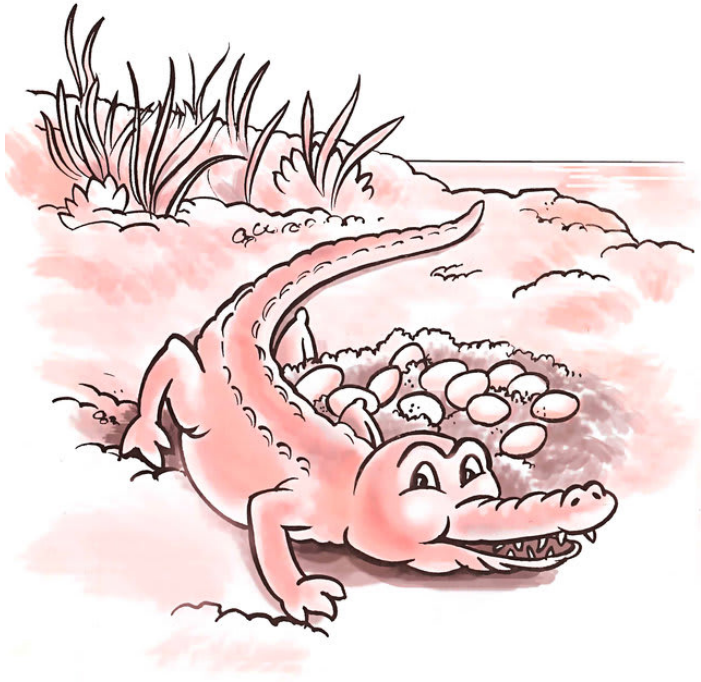
This is where the potatoes and sweet potatoes grow!



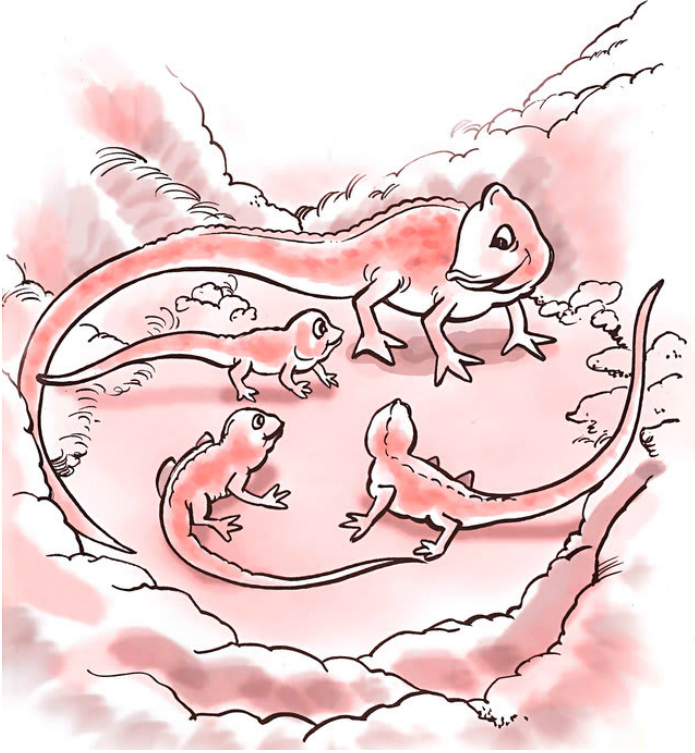
The soil is where the mud dauber builds its nest.
