Elle a des taches qui sont de taille et de forme égales. Elle a un corps rouge avec des taches noires.



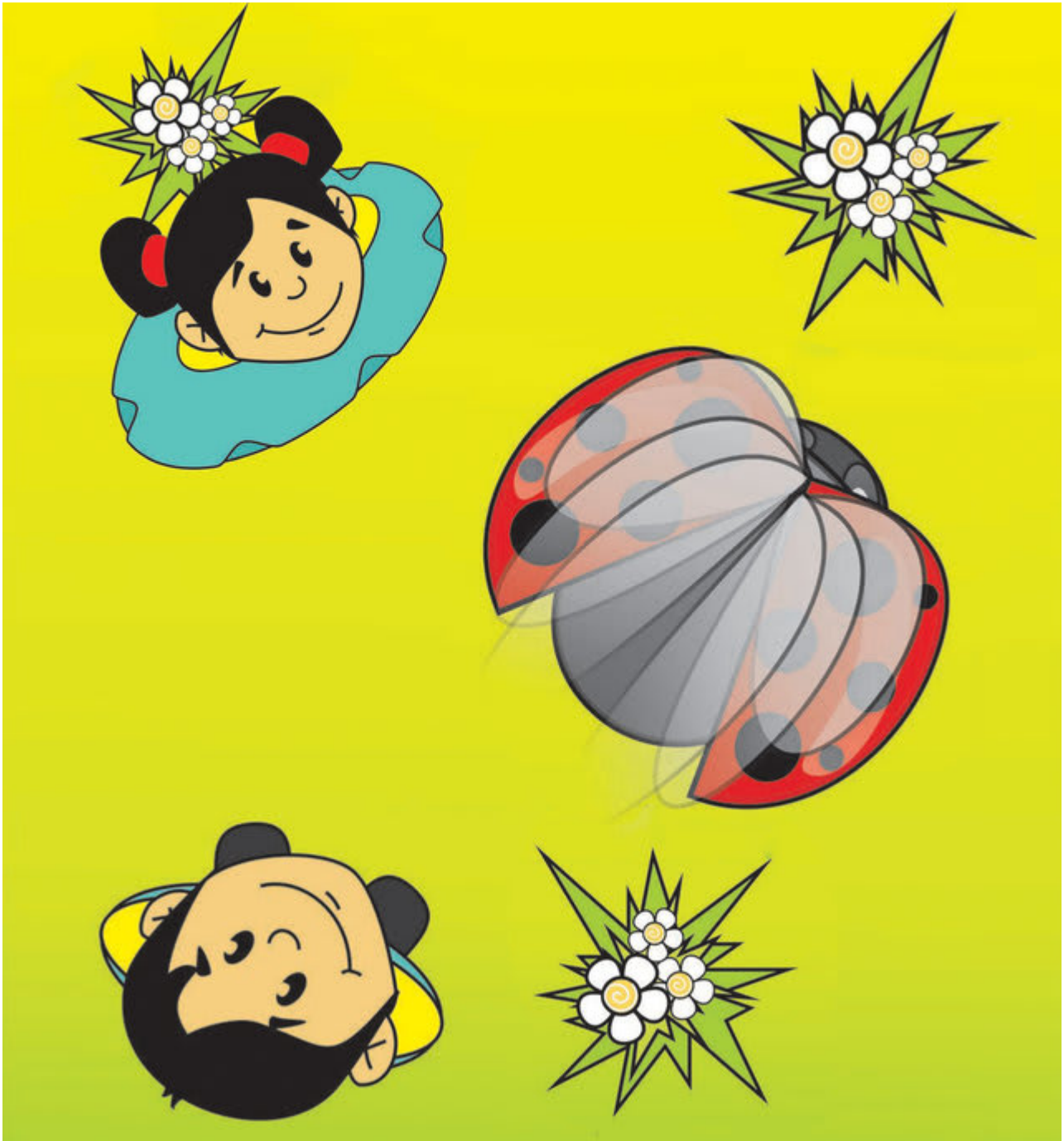
