


The Queen

When the sun came up, she hid in the jungle.





But after a few years of ruling her kingdom, the queen decided she wanted something different and gave up her crown. People were surprised, but she was listening to her heart.



Shin Saw Pu moved to Yangon to be close to Shwedagon Pagoda and dedicated the rest of her life to prayer and other religious activities. She also made Shwedagon the Buddhist shrine and icon it is today. She had her weight in gold hammered into thin sheets, called gold leaf, and she covered the pagoda with them. Later rulers (all men) followed her example, and, even today, visitors decorate Shwedagon with gold leaf. Shin Saw Pu was a queen, but she is celebrated today for the accomplishments she achieved without a crown.
