


Kakapo Wants to Fly

Kakapo wished he could fly just like his friends.




One day, Kakapo made a big decision. He would learn how to fly, no matter what!



Kakapo climbed a hill and spread his short little wings as wide as he could. "OK wings. Get ready, set, fly!"Kakapo leaped into the air with all his might.




But he did not fly. He just fell down into the mud! It took all day to clean it out of his feathers.




But Kakapo did not give up. He would find another way to fly!

But suddenly, the branch broke in two.Kakapo fell down and bumped his head on the rocks beside the waterfall. But his body bounced off the rock!




Kakapo was flying through the air! He felt wonderful and began to flap his wings. Eventually, Kakapo bounced into the water.
